We're excited to announce the Wahlstrom Nordic Workshop April 8, 9 and 10, 2022, at the Beaver Creek Nature Reserve in Fall Creek, Wisconsin! After last year's event was cancelled due to the ongoing pandemic, we look forward to welcoming students back to Beaver Creek Nature Reserve.

As always, this year's program will include Nordic games, ax casting, spark sled races, woodcarving, weaving, folk dancing, home cooked meals, use of snowshoes and cross country skis, weather permitting, as well as discussions and presentations about Nordic culture on both sides of the Atlantic.

Thanks to a generous grant from the American Scandinavian Foundation, we'll also be hosting folk artists James Miller and Tara Lynn Austin to teach flat -plane carving and rosemaling, respectively. We're excited to offer this additional folk arts programming "Tour of Traditions" alongside our regular woodcarving, weaving, and folk dancing, which this year will take a more pronounced place during the weekend.

To ensure everyone is staying safe, we've instituted a pandemic plan that includes masks being required indoors
